IFLA Europe General Assembly 2013 in Berlin

This document provides you with the information on the organizational framework of the IFLA Europe General Assembly 2013, which will take place in Berlin (Germany).

General Assembly: The General Assembly will be held on Saturday 21st and Sunday 22nd of September.

Celebration 100 years bdla: On Friday the 20th of September, all participants to the General Assembly are invited to the bdla main jubilee event in 2013: the centenary of the Bund Deutscher Landschaftsarchitekten bdla.

The celebration will be held in the centre of Berlin next to the Brandenburg Gate. The function will start at 7 pm and preludes a joint party for and with Landscape Architects. Early registration is free but compulsory!

Come together Saturday evening: On Saturday night (September 21st) IFLA Europe and bdla offer you to discover Berlin by night. We promise splendid views of one of Europe's most fascinating metropolis. This discovery journey will be carried out by boat. Due to the limited capacity (60 guests) only delegates, presidents and observers will be able to join.

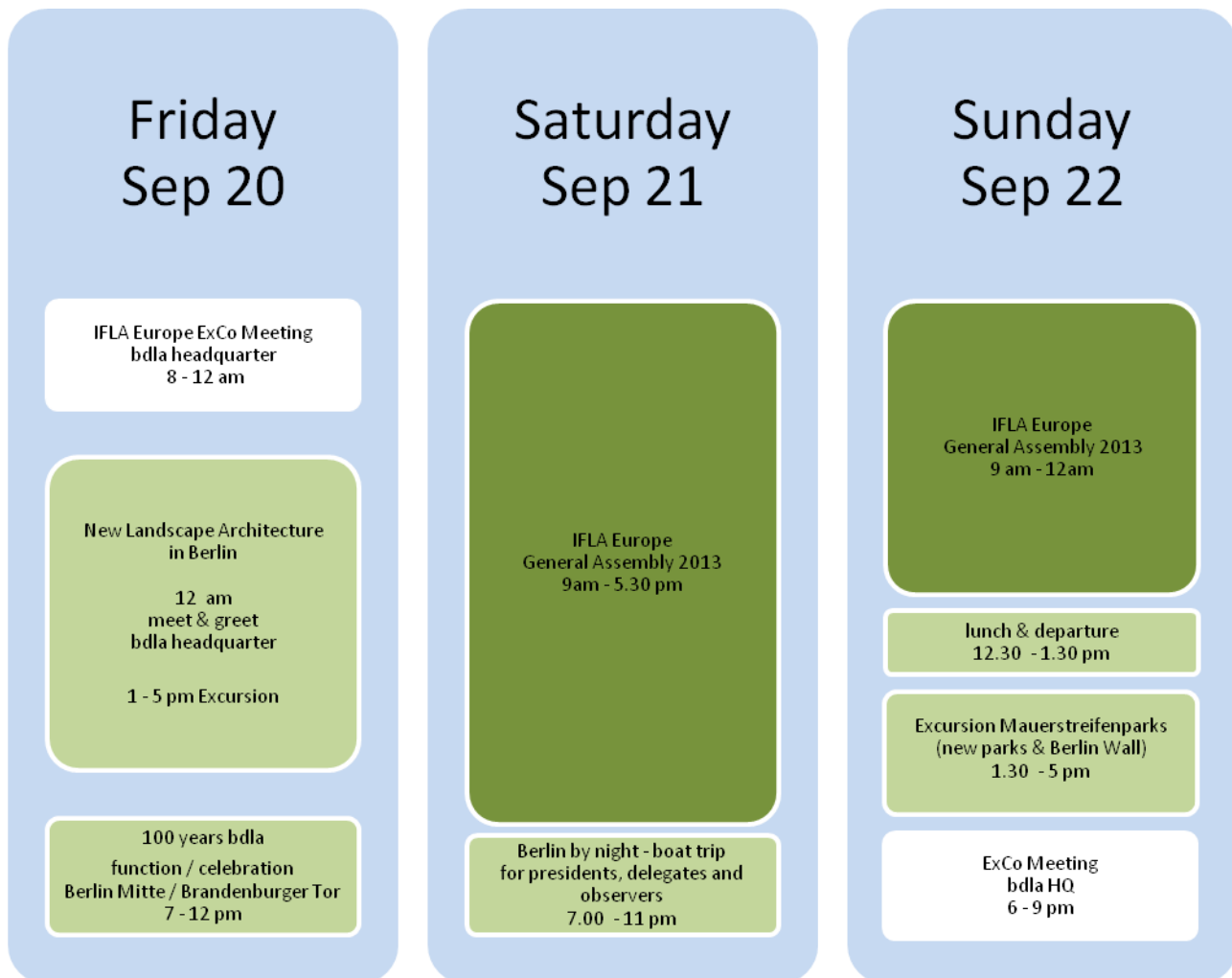
Technical tours: Friday the 20th and Sunday the 22nd afternoon bdla will offer excursions (by foot and bus) to see and discuss Berlin's contemporary Landscape Architecture.

On Friday we will start with a 'meet & greet' at the bdla headquarters from where the excursion will start.

And on Sunday, it is planned to visit the parks along the former Berlin Wall. A very flexible walk in order to allow individual departures on Sunday afternoon will be arranged.

Hotel & Registration for GA 2013:

Rooms have been secured at the Mikon Eastgate Hotel & the Ibis Berlin City Potsdamer Platz.

All participants whether they are associations' presidents or observers can book in either both hotels.

According to the organisation's regulations, IFLA Europe will refund expenses for one (only) delegate. The following expenses will be paid directly by IFLA Europe: two nights including breakfast at the hotel selected by IFLA Europe (any additional night and breakfast at charge of the delegate); the two lunches of the GA (Saturday and Sunday) and the dinner of Saturday evening (except drinks). As for the plane ticket, it will be refunded on production of the ticket. **It is strongly recommended to book your plane as soon as possible to benefit from preferential fares.**



In case the delegate (or his/ her representative) is unable to attend the General Assembly, then the Federation will refund expenses for the president on the same conditions than for the delegate.

Therefore, Christine Bavassa, executive secretary, will organize, as usual, the hotel bookings for delegates and the registration to the General Assembly.
